## Essential Items to Have When Traveling

**\*\*\*YOUR CHILD'S AIRWAY "GO" BAG GOES EVERYWHERE YOU GO – INCLUDING THE HOSPITAL\*\*\***

### **Equipment and Supplies:**

- Airway "Go" Bag
- Portable suction fully charged
- Shoulder roll or towel
- Gloves and hand sanitizer
- Pulse oximeter with extra sensor
- Oxygen tank with carrying case (check the amount before leaving. If <500 psi, replace tank).
- Letter with medical history, doctors' contact information and emergency numbers

### **For longer trips >4hrs:**

- Cough Assist (if ordered)
- Vest Machine with wrap (if ordered)
- IPV (if ordered)

### **If Vented:**

- Ventilator with power cord
- Fully charged batteries
- Extra battery cables and car adaptor
- Ventilator circuit
- Oxygen tubing

## Airway “Go” Bag

### CONTENTS:

#### Front Pocket (Emergency Pocket)

- Trach (same size)
- Trach (one size smaller)
- Set of trach ties
- Scissors
- Split gauze or barrier (as applicable)
- Packet of lubricant

\*For cuffed trachs:

- Syringes
- Bottle of sterile water

#### Back of the Bag

- Suction Catheters
- In-line Suction (if applicable)
- Suction tubing
- Yankauer
- Resuscitator bag and mask with PEEP adaptor
- Safe suction guide (attached to side of bag)
- Tape

#### Small Bag (miscellaneous content, as applicable):

- Pink saline bullets
- Oxygen tubing
- Pulse oximeter sensor
- Whisper swivel (if on Trilogy ventilator)

Always carry your child's prescriptions for respiratory equipment, medicine, and oxygen. You will need them when checking in at your child's appointments.
